## **Arizona State University**

SOC 791/499 – Advanced Qualitative Analysis and Writing Description: This advanced qualitative analysis and writing course takes students through the manuscript writing process. Students in this course will advance their research skills related to qualitative analysis, mixed methods analysis, scholarly writing, and dissemination.

SOC 591/498 – Qualitative Methods: Coding and Analysis Description: This qualitative research course is a practice-focused examination of what scholars do with the data they collect or produce from a range of sources in order to generate justice-oriented knowledge. Students in this course will advance their research skills related to qualitative data collection, analysis, and dissemination. Students also develop their "researcher mind" while honing the range of their analytical abilities. Throughout the course, we consider relationships among research questions, ethics, epistemologies, methodologies, methods, data, and analysis, and reflect on the role of technology and politics in research.

SOC 591/498 – Qualitative Research Methods: Interviewing Description: This qualitative research course is a practicum that teaches students how to conduct interviews and use photovoice techniques through hands-on experience. Students also have the opportunity to work in teams with professors and postdocs involved in the project, building their teamwork skills and learning from experienced qualitative researchers.
